There's plenty to experience outside the Chinese Garden as well.

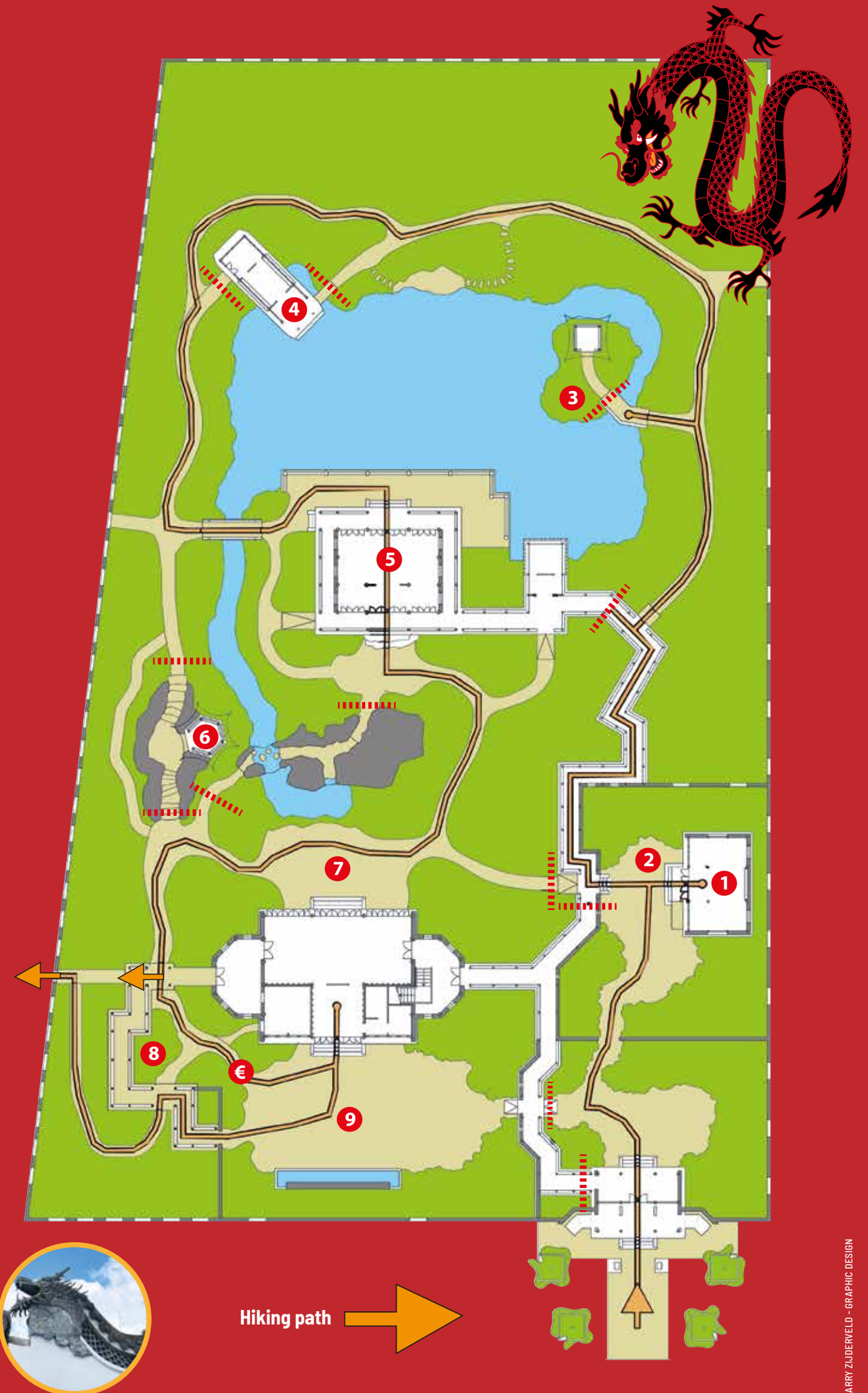

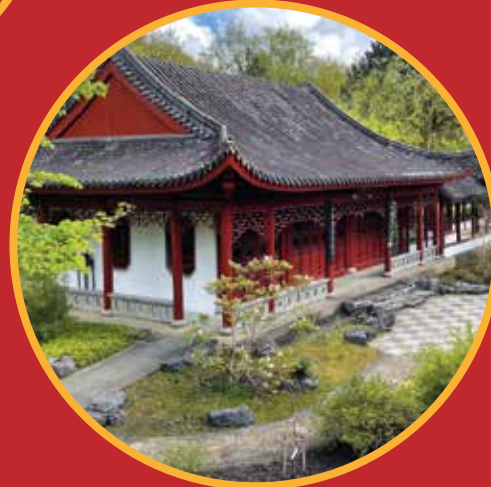
